

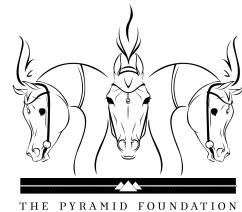

From the East:

Take I-64 across the Daniel Boone Bridge (Missouri River); it becomes 40/61 to Lake St. Louis Blvd. Exit turn left @ stoplight we are 1.8 miles on left.

OR

Take I-70 west to 40/61 East to Lake St. Louis Blvd. Exit turn left @ stoplight we are 1.8 miles on left.

From the West:

Take I-70 to the 40/61 East exit Lake St. Louis Blvd. Exit turn left @ stoplight we are 1.8 miles on left. If you are on 40/61 already, then cross over I-70 and continue as noted above.

FESTIVAL ENTRY GUIDELINES ELIGIBILITY AND DEFINITION OF THE STRAIGHT EGYPTIAN ARABIAN

Exhibition in the “Meet the Egyptians” demonstration is open to any horse owned by a current Pyramid Society member that is registered or eligible for registration by a registry approved by the World Arabian Horse Organization (WAHO) and traces in every line of its pedigree to horses listed in The Pyramid Society Studbook for Straight Egyptian Arabian Horses Worldwide, ©2016, The Pyramid Society, Lexington, Kentucky, USA,”

OPEN BARNS

Food and Drink: Due to public health safety precautions, all food and beverages will be served from one central area. Our Hospitality Sponsor will dispense food and beverage individually to visitors using masks and gloves. Due to liability, no smoking is allowed in the arena or stabling areas and no alcohol is to be served.

Presentation of Horses: Horses may be presented to the public during Open Barn. Safety is of the utmost importance for our spectators, which will include very enthusiastic children. Horses must be haltered and under the control of a handler through an open stall door or in the aisleway, with no visitors behind the horse. A large perimeter should be maintained with crowds held back by an assistant when in the aisleway. Guests who pet horses should use hand disinfectant between barns.

STABLING INFORMATION

STALL ASSIGNMENTS

Stalls will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE TIMES

Exhibitor fees cover the period from Thursday, September 2, 11:30 AM CT through Sunday, September 5, 9 AM CT. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday at 9 AM. EARLY ARRIVAL and LATE DEPARTURE STALLS, occupied by animals, humans, tack, equipment, feed, supplies and/or other property will be subject to additional fees. **Please check-in at the West show office upon arrival to present your health and transport documents.**

STALL DECORATIONS

We encourage ALL exhibitors to decorate their stalls. End stalls facing the main aisle should be decorated to enhance the Open Barn experience. Stall doors and fronts may be decorated but should be done in such a manner that each horse stabled within can be seen by anyone, at all

times. NOTE: No holes may be drilled, cored, or punched without prior written approval by facility management. This includes the stabling area. See NEC rules outlined below.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

REQUIREMENTS & RULES REGARDING USE OF EXTENSION CORDS IN STALLS, BARN, OR TENTS: All appliances and extension cords must be 3-pronged, outdoor heavy-duty rated, and grounded. All power strips must be ground fault protected. Under NO circumstances may an extension cord be buried or covered. Do not wrap cords around any metal object including the bars on the stalls.

BEDDING, FEED AND HAY

Exhibitor fees do not include shavings. Two (2) bales of shavings coverage are required at all times on the floor of each animal-occupied stall. **Shavings must be exclusively purchased from and provided by NEC.** No shavings or alternate bedding shall be brought onto NEC premises without express permission of the FACILITY DIRECTOR. NEC shall deliver shavings to stalls only after an approved order and secured payment have been submitted. Once shavings are delivered, they cannot be returned for a refund.

NATIONAL EQUESTRIAN CENTER RULES

SMOKING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED BY St. Charles County & Lake St. Louis ordinances

- NO OPEN FLAMES in barns or indoors at any time
- LUNGING IS PERMITTED in DESIGNATED AREAS ONLY
- ALL UNATTENDED HORSES must be STALLED
- KEEP BLACK HOOF POLISH on dirt floors or disposal surfaces
- ARRANGE ALL STALL DISASSEMBLING with NEC in advance
- LEASHED FRIENDLY DOGS are welcome in public areas
- KEEP MOTORIZED VEHICLES out of barns and buildings at all times
- OUTSIDE SHAVINGS require PRE-AUTHORIZATION
- KEEP FIRE LANES, MANURE PITS and UN/LOADING ZONES CLEAR of parked vehicles

- PARK Trailers in Trailer Parking, RVs in RV Parking and Cars/Trucks in Vehicle Parking
- ARRANGE Grey/Black water DUMPING with NEC in advance. MOBILE Services are available
- DEFACING, DAMAGING OR DESTROYING NEC Property will incur fines
- FOR SAFETY, USE NO STAPLES, NAILS, SCREWS, OR HOOKS inside stalls
- KEEP HORSES OFF CONCRETE walkways and patios
- ACCESS TO VIP/RESERVED AREAS is LIMITED to VIP Guests
- REFRAIN from USING DANGEROUS OR DISRUPTIVE MATERIALS (Such as glass containers, open-flame BBQs, space heaters, electric blankets, fireworks, airhorns)

MUCK DISPOSAL: All muck must be placed in marked muck bins. Any muck placed in the barns, at the ends of the barns, or in any other non-designated area will incur fines.

CATERING - NEC retains exclusive rights to operate all food service and catering functions at NEC, no entity may provide food or catering services without the express written consent of FACILITY DIRECTOR. It is understood that, in general, no self-catering will be allowed for events attended by exhibitors, participants, guests or the general public. Any self-catered or donated food items served at NEC must be pre approved by FACILITY DIRECTOR in writing. NEC holds all authority to approve or decline all self-catering requests. A fee of no less than \$200.00 will be imposed for any unauthorized self-catering.

EQUINE HEALTH REGULATIONS

To review regulations for your specific state, visit: <https://www.interstatelivestock.com/>. Exhibitors must check in at the West Show Office upon arrival to present health and transport documents.

1. A description sufficient to identify the individual equine including, but not limited to, name, age, breed, color, gender, distinctive markings, and unique and permanent forms of identification when present (e.g., brands, tattoos, scars, cowlicks, blemishes or biometric measurements).
2. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued by an accredited veterinarian 30 days before entry, with identification recorded on the CVI.
3. Negative EIA (equine infectious anemia) test within 12 months prior to entry. Laboratory name, date of test and test result must be recorded on the CVI. If a foal is moving by mother's side, it does not require a test.

4. If animals are traveling from a county with a positive Vesicular Stomatitis premise you must obtain an entry permit and include the VS statement: I have examined these animals and verify they are free of signs of Vesicular Stomatitis and they have not been on a positive premises within the last 14 days. Entry permit required and must be recorded on the CVI. Please call 573-751-3377 (7:30 AM - 5:00 PM Central), or use the online permitting system, which requires prior registration.
5. Horses should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

RULES OF CONDUCT

CODE OF CONDUCT ON THE SHOW GROUNDS AND ABUSE: Horses shall not be punished unnecessarily or severely anywhere on the show grounds. Actions including the excessive use of whips, excessive stimulation by noise or intimidation, excessive jerking or excessive circling of the horse, or intentional infliction of pain by any means (exception for emergency control of the horse) are forbidden in all parts of the show ground, or stable areas at all times. The Show Committee and Veterinarian(s) all have the authority to take immediate action against any person in violation of this Code of Conduct. All rules as contained in the USEF Rulebook General Section apply as follows:

WELFARE OF THE HORSE GR839 CRUELTY TO AND ABUSE OF A HORSE Cruelty to or the abuse of a horse by any person at a Licensed Competition is forbidden, constitutes a violation under Chapter 7, and renders the offender subject to penalty. The Show Committee must bar violators from further participation for the remainder of the competition. It is the duty of the competition officials and any properly constituted humane organization to report to the Federation any person who indulges in this practice for such further action as may be deemed appropriate. The Federation or the Judge or Steward may appoint a veterinarian to inspect any animal in competition. Refusal to submit an animal for examination by an authorized veterinarian after due notification shall constitute a violation. Any action(s) against a horse by a competitor or an exhibitor, which are deemed excessive by a judge, Federation steward, technical delegate or competition veterinarian, in the competition ring or anywhere on the competition grounds may be punished by official warning, elimination, or other sanctions which may be deemed appropriate by the Show Committee. Such action(s) could include but are not limited to excessive use of the whip, spurs, or bamboo poles. Competitors and exhibitors have the right to contest any action taken pursuant to GR839.5 by filing a protest or grievance pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Rules for hearing and determination by the Hearing Committee.

DISGUIISING OF EXHIBITS: No alteration of the basic color of the skin, coat or hooves is permitted. Colorless hoof varnishes, Vaseline or oil may be accepted. Horses may be fully or partly body clipped subject to eyelashes being intact, an unroached mane, and a full natural tail. Tactile hair left intact around the nose, muzzle and eyes is encouraged. Balding the area around the eyes or proximal to the muzzle and nostrils is not permitted.

ADMINISTRATION OF CHEMICAL IRRITANTS/GINGER: No horse may be presented with any chemical or other irritant of any kind present on its anus, vulva, rectal area or vaginal area, regardless of the origin of the irritant and whether it was applied or its presence resulted from dietary, environmental or unknown origins, and whether the horse's tail carriage was affected by its presence, per USEF AR103.5.

APPOINTMENTS AND WHIPS: In all halter classes a suitable headstall equipped with throatlatch is mandatory. One whip per handler. No item may be used inside or outside the ring while showing a horse except one whip. Whips are to be no longer than six feet (6') including snapper/ lash/appendage. Small appendages (no more than 12 inches in length) of ribbon, plastic, etc., are permitted. Please see USEF AR 114 Breeding-In-Hand appointments.

DISPUTE NOT COVERED BY RULES: Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee, whose decision will be final.

DRUGS AND MEDICATIONS: The drugs and medication rules contained in USEF Rule Book Chapter 4 will be enforced.

SMOKING AND ALCOHOL are prohibited.

EXHIBITOR CONDUCT, DISCIPLINE AND DISQUALIFICATION: Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to staff or officials on the part of the owner, groom, rider, driver or member of the family of the person participating in the show, will disqualify the horse/rider from participation. The Management reserves to itself the right to remove any of the above named from the festival without being liable for compensation or damages.

EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES: The Pyramid Society reserves the right, in its sole discretion and judgment, to cancel or alter the Festival in the event of any occurrence beyond its control which, in its opinion, threatens the health, safety or wellbeing, of the horses or participants. In the event of such cancellation or alteration, the recourse against The Pyramid Society shall be limited solely to a refund of any exhibitor's fees previously paid to The Pyramid Society.

HOLDING PADDOCK CONDUCT: The holding paddock area is only for those horses exhibiting/entering the ring. NO other horses will be allowed in the holding paddock. Each handler will be allowed ONE attendee in the holding paddock to help animate the horse in a CONTROLLED manner. According to AR 114 a small appendage at the end of the whip is allowed as follows: "Whips are to be no longer than 6' including snapper/ lash/appendage. Small appendages (no more than 12 inches in length) of ribbon, plastic, etc. are permitted." The Show management has the right to deem any accessory as unsuitable, if it affects the safety or stress of those involved. Please use extreme caution with horses and other exhibitors. ALL ACTIVITY TO ANIMATE THE HORSE MUST TAKE PLACE IN THE DESIGNATED HOLDING PADDOCK! NO ACTIVITY SUCH AS RUNNING THE HORSE ON ANY ROADWAY WILL BE ALLOWED.

Only the horse entering and the horse on deck will be allowed the use of the attendee and accessory for animation. ALL OTHER HORSES ARE TO REMAIN QUIET AND AT A SAFE DISTANCE FROM THE ENTRY GATE. The purpose of the foregoing rules is to encourage the expression of natural Arabian charisma in a controlled and safe environment. The use and scope of assistants in animating horses is at the SOLE discretion of the Show Manager and the Show Committee.
